### "Everyone knows before us"

Safety issue posted on social media

Once notified, staff jumps into action to evaluate using standard policies and procedures

#### Don't hesitate

Social media enables information (not always accurate) to spread like wildfire

#### Proactive Steps Staff Takes

- Creating false profiles and "friending" students
- Using PIO's social media monitoring service
- Periodically checking certain students', parents' or employees' social media accounts

#### If you don't hear about it first...

- Parents and students feel uneasy
- Attendance drops
- Media frames the story missing facts
- Instruction time impacted
- Hard costs incurred

### Impact of Social Media


The use of social media is no longer widespread... it's pervasive.

95% of 12-17 year olds and 98% of 18-24 year olds use social media daily. On mobile devices, 24% of users are using social media "almost constantly."

## Emerging Risks




"...you shouldn't ignore social media as a tool for understanding and managing emerging risks.
