This Exemption has been asserted to protect information properly classified in the interest of national security pursuant to Executive Order 12958, as amended. Portions of these documents may have also been withheld pursuant to Exemption has been asserted in conjunction with the National Security Act of 1947, which protects sensitive intelligence sources and methods. In this instance Exemption 3 has been asserted to protect the names and/or e-mail addresses of certain staff within the federal intelligence community, and material identifying any telecommunication companies (telecoms).

Part II: Description of documents withheld in part. Portions of these documents were withheld pursuant to Exemptions 1, 3 and 5 as referenced above.
