

of 544 pages of documents reviewed and 448 pages of documents released to EFF. Decl.

¶¶ 8–10. The FBI anticipates making a fourth interim release on or before March 1, 2008, representing approximately 193 pages of documents reviewed.¹ Decl. ¶ 16.

The FBI is continuing the process of reviewing potentially responsive documents to determine whether they are in fact responsive to EFF's FOIA requests; approximately 49,928 pages of potentially responsive documents remain to be reviewed. Decl. ¶¶ 13–15. Although the FBI earlier anticipated that it would be able to complete this initial scoping review process by December 2007, several intervening factors, described more fully in the declaration, have prevented the FBI from completing the scoping review process according to the schedule anticipated earlier. Decl. ¶ 13.

¹ The estimate of 193 pages represents the total number of pages to be reviewed and does not necessarily reflect the total number of pages that will be released to EFF.
