

If DPS becomes subject to a legislative change, revocation of statutory authority, or lack of appropriated funds which would render DPS's or bidder's delivery or performance under the contract impossible or unnecessary, the contract will be terminated or cancelled and be deemed null and void. In the event of a termination or cancellation under this Section, DPS will not be liable to bidder for any damages, which are caused or associated with such termination, or cancellation and DPS will not be required to give prior notice.

15. TEXAS PUBLIC INFORMATION ACT:

Notwithstanding any provisions of this IFB to the contrary, bidder understands that DPS will comply with the Texas Public Information Act (Chapter 552, Gov't Code) as interpreted by judicial opinions and opinions of the Attorney General of the State of Texas. Information, documentation, and other material in connection with this solicitation or any resulting contract may be subject to public disclosure pursuant to the Texas Public Information Act. 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ITEM 1: MID-LEVEL MAINTENANCE

Vendor will support TXDPS in the continuing expansion and development of their UAS program to include advising on refurbishment
protocols and procedures. Vendor will maintain an inventory of parts, supplies and diagnostic equipment to support both a FieldLevel and a Mid-Level maintenance program that facilitates repairs to the WASP Micro-unmanned aircraft system.



Vendor will support TXDPS in the continuing expansion and development of their UAS program to include advising on refurbishment
protocols and procedures. Vendor will maintain an inventory of parts, supplies and diagnostic equipment to support both a FieldLevel and a Mid-Level maintenance program that facilitates repairs to the WASP Micro-unmanned aircraft system.


